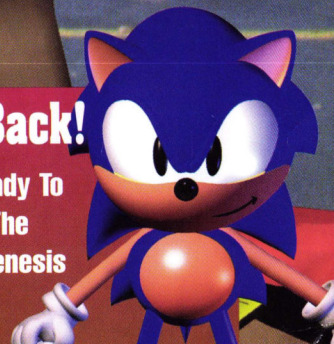

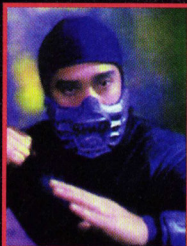

We would have to agree the 3DO is a pretty cool machine and has some truly great games. But you're right. There isn't much to show for as far as new games are concerned. On the other hand it could easily be argued that there are more new 3DO games being made than SNES and Genesis.

You've also brought up an interesting point about 3DO making games for other systems. Since 3DO has sold Panasonic all the rights to the M2 hardware, it is possible that Studio 3DO (which is the 3DO software division) could make games for any system that will make them money. Will they go straight to the Saturn and PlayStation as soon as possible? We think not! Studio 3DO will have to wait and see what happens with the M2, but we are willing to bet that if sales of the M2 aren't good you'll see Studio 3DO making games for whoever they want.

Concerning the presentation of the M2 hardware, Panasonic will make it available in two versions. One works as an expansion for the original 3DO (although the CD-ROM drive will only be double-speed), and the other is a stand alone unit that will also be compatible with original 3DO software (sporting a speedy four-speed CD-ROM).

Lastly, if your friend won't listen... he won't listen. Let him buy it! Of course, all he'll want to do is play your 3DO, but YOU wouldn't want him playing YOUR system since YOU apparently don't know what you're talking about! See how he lives with that! (That was sarcasm, y'know.)
