The latest card game to sweep the States is the Killer Instinct Collectible Card Game which allows players to recreate all the ultra-violent thrills n' spills of the coin-op on a table-top. Starting off with a special starter pack of cards, players can then add new moves and combos to their decks by buying additional sets of cards, in a similar fashion to collecting bubble-gum cards. Produced by Topps, the cards feature graphics from the arcade game and special rendered artwork by Rare.

Those Mighty Morphin' Power Rangers are taking a well-earned break from their usual punching and kicking antics and are set to return to the Super NES in a new racing game called Power Race Zero. The game is a mixture of racing and destruction derby, and features a variety of gameplay options. Similar to the classic Super Mario Kart, a two-player battle mode can also be selected, in which both players have unlimited fire power and are given 99 seconds to blow each other away!
