**DAVE:** (1) With the exception of Toy Story, which is okay but not brilliant, they're all tops. I would probably buy Wario Land and start saving for Diddy's Kong Quest. (2) No, it doesn't. For once, Mario takes a back seat and lets someone else to take the credit. (3) Super Mario Land is still in my top five on Game Boy. Even now, I always take it on holiday to keep me amused whilst soaking up the sun. (4) The majority of games are going to be either 64 or a whopping 96 meg. (5) It's up to the programmers as to whether or not they develop the game to work with the analogue stick. (6) With Nintendo having just released the new Game Boy Pocket in Japan, it seems unlikely they'll stop developing for it. There's also very little chance of Virtual Boy being released in the UK. (7) The problem with Virtual Boy is the lack of quality software. At present only Wario Land has been worth playing, but with Zero Racers (seen last issue under the name G-Zero) looking pretty damn cool, that could be about to change. (8) Unfortunately, Squaresoft have deserted Nintendo at present, but we still firmly believe they'll be back to develop for the N64. (9) War Gods from Williams is the only other beat-'em-up to be confirmed but there will be plenty more, don't you worry.
